


3D Miniature Artwork Assembly Instructions

This miniature printable wall art includes extra elements to create depth and a 3D appearance, so it doesn't just sit flat on the wall. You can of course choose to cut out the artwork only and place it in a real frame.

Example artwork printable with fold lines illustrated:



Essentially you are creating a 'box'. The printable includes sides for depth and back panels that fold together.

A separate back piece is added to strengthen the box and make it easier to attach string for hanging the artwork.

Each miniature wall art printable comes in multiple sizes to suit 1:6 and 1:12 scale dollhouses.

For best results, print the wall art page on cardstock, minimum 200gsm. I have printed with 176gsm card stock and it was ok but 200gsm produces a more sturdy result.

Materials you'll need

1. Miniature artwork PDF printable
2. White cardstock (preferably minimum 200gsm) – A4 or US letter size
3. Colour printer that can print on cardstock
4. Paper glue
5. Scissors or craft knife
6. Ruler (optional)
7. Fold scoring tool (optional)
8. Small piece of string or kitchen twine for hanging artwork
9. Sticky (adhesive) tape for attaching string/twine
10. Something pointy to pierce holes in the back piece for string to thread through (optional – you can just attach string with sticky tape without threading through)

Instructions

1. Download the printable PDF and print the artwork and back piece on cardstock, preferably minimum 200gsm, using your printer's best ink setting (you can print the back piece on normal setting or even just cut out your own from recycled cardboard).
2. Before cutting the artwork piece, use a ruler and scoring tool to score along the 'fold lines' (illustrated above). This makes folding the sides easier and gives a cleaner edge. If you don't have a scoring tool you can eyeball it and fold by hand.
3. Cut out the artwork and back panel along the solid outer edges.
4. Fold the top and bottom tabs over and place glue on edges.
5. Fold one of the side panels over the glued top and bottom flaps and hold in position until it feels secure.
6. Place glue along the edge of the side panel, and then fold over the other side panel. Hold in position until it feels secure.
7. Pierce two holes into the separate back piece and thread string/twine through to the wrong side, tying a knot at each end. Secure string/twine on the wrong side with adhesive tape.
8. Attach wrong side of the back piece to the artwork back with glue.
9. Once glue is dry hang your beautiful new artwork in your dollhouse.
